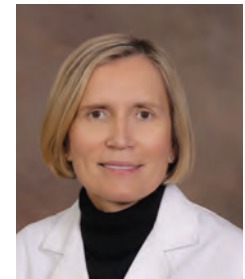

Newly Renovated Emergency Department Opens

On May 20th, we proudly cut the ribbon on our newly renovated Emergency Department, marking a major milestone in our mission to provide faster, more comfortable, and more efficient care to the Lakelands region.

Care Close to Home Matters

When Greenwood restaurant owner and community leader Howard Corley talks about Self Regional Medical Center, he doesn't hesitate. "I've had nothing but great experiences," he said. "From the moment you walk in, it's genuine service. We are blessed to have this hospital right here in Greenwood."

Over the past several years, Howard has relied on Self Regional for several significant health needs, including shoulder surgery after a fall and treatment for a serious blood clot following international travel. In each instance, he says the care was immediate, skilled and compassionate. After falling in his driveway on Labor Day weekend and severely injuring his shoulder, Howard was quickly evaluated, X-rayed, and referred for surgery. "They got me right in," he recalled. "Everyone, from the imaging team to the surgical staff, was over the top. The doctors here are as good as anywhere in the Southeast."

A few years earlier, Howard returned home from a trip to Greece with increasing leg pain. What he initially thought was a pulled muscle turned out to be a blood clot. Thanks to prompt evaluation in the Emergency Department and coordinated follow-up care with his physician, he was quickly placed on treatment and closely monitored. "It was handled immediately and professionally," he said. "I felt completely confident in the care I was receiving."

In another frightening episode, Howard was hospitalized with a condition that affected his balance and left him needing to relearn how to walk. Through inpatient care and rehabilitation services at Self Regional, he steadily regained strength and mobility. "The rehab team was incredible," he said.

"Within a couple of weeks, I was back on my feet and getting back to work. What they do over there is powerful." - Howard Corley

Howard and his wife, Glenda, are active supporters of the Self Regional Healthcare Foundation. But he is quick to note that his positive experiences are not about special treatment. "I truly believe everyone receives that same level of care," he said. "You don't have to leave Greenwood to get excellent medical treatment. That's important for our whole community."

For Howard, Self Regional Medical Center represents more than a hospital, it is a vital community asset that ensures friends, neighbors and families can receive high-quality care close to home. "We're fortunate," he said. "This hospital wants Greenwood to thrive, and it shows."

Madame Curie Society Fall Education Event

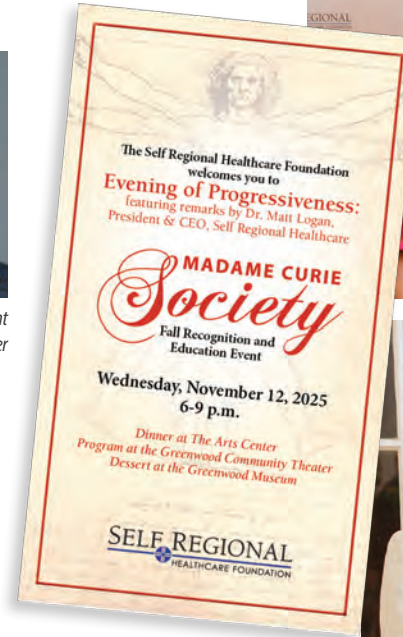

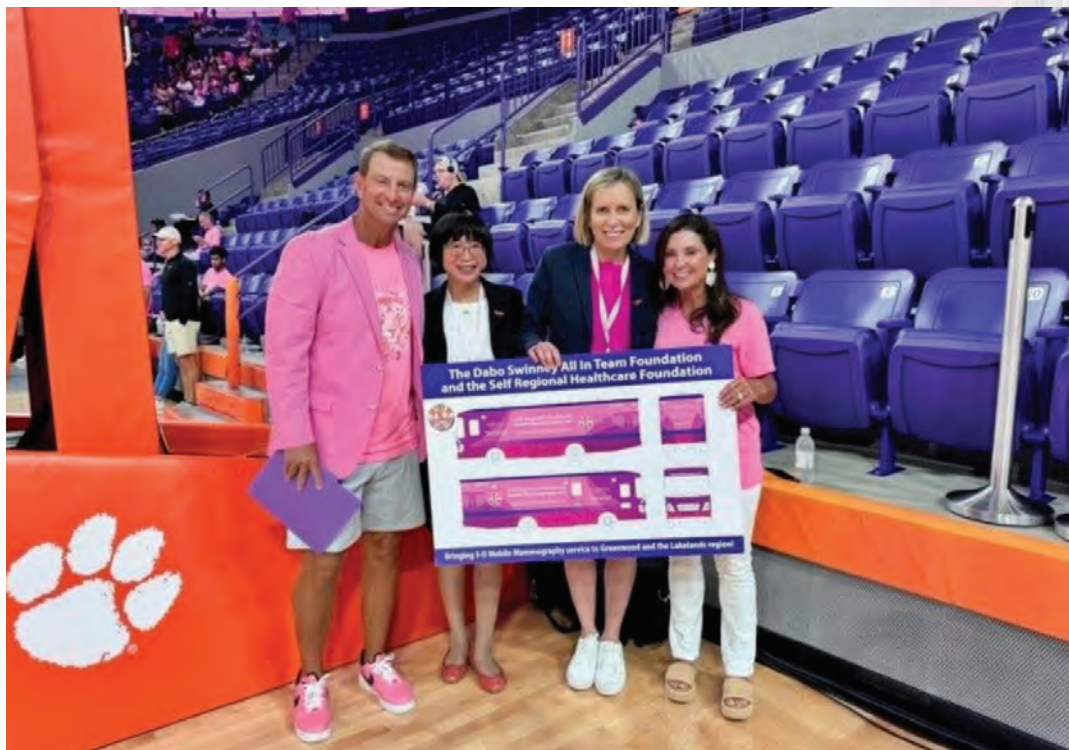


Mobile Mammography Brings Hope

Philanthropy and Planned Giving

How the One Big Beautiful Bill is Shaping Philanthropy and Planned Giving in 2025

On July 4, 2025, the One Big Beautiful Bill Act, officially enacted as Public Law 119-21, was signed into law, ushering in one of the most significant overhauls of the U.S. tax code in recent years. This sweeping legislation builds on and extends key portions of prior tax law while adding new provisions that affect individuals, families, businesses, and nonprofit organizations alike. With hundreds of pages of changes across tax and spending policy, the law represents a pivotal moment for donors and planned giving professionals to reassess both strategy and opportunity.

One of the most widely discussed aspects of the bill is its extension and permanence of the individual income tax rates that had been scheduled to expire at the end of 2025. These rates, many of which were first introduced following the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act of 2017, are now made permanent, providing long-term predictability for taxpayers and donors. The standard deduction and key tax credits are also maintained at higher levels, which can influence how individuals approach deductions, including charitable contributions, on their federal returns.

For many in the philanthropic community, the One Big Beautiful Bill introduces both opportunities and complications on charitable giving incentives. On the positive side, the law reinstates an above-the-line charitable contribution deduction for individuals who do not itemize their deductions, meaning more taxpayers may benefit from tax relief related to gifts made to qualified charities. At the same time, for itemizers, the legislation places a floor on deductible amounts, such that only contributions exceeding a set percentage of adjusted gross income are deductible. These dual changes make it more important than ever for donors to understand which tax approach, standard deduction versus itemizing, best aligns with their giving goals. The bill also introduces important implications for corporate and foundation giving. Under the new law, corporations generally may only deduct charitable contributions that exceed 1 percent of taxable income (while still subject to a maximum of 10 percent), and the excise tax on large private foundations' investment income has been expanded to apply higher rates based on endowment size. These changes could reduce the after-tax benefits of philanthropy for some institutional donors, potentially affecting budgeting and long-term giving strategies across the nonprofit sector.

Looking for a smart, tax-efficient way to give?

As you plan ahead for the 2026 tax year, you may be exploring options to lower your taxable income. If you are age 70½ or older, you have the opportunity to support Self Regional Healthcare Foundation by making a gift directly from your IRA.

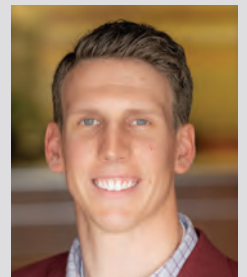
This type of contribution, called a qualified charitable distribution, allows you to make an immediate impact. If you are required to take a minimum distribution, your gift can count toward meeting that requirement.

Moreover, the One Big Beautiful Bill permanently extends the federal estate and gift tax exemption, indexed for inflation, which has clear implications for planned giving. Donors looking to reduce potential estate tax liabilities may find charitable bequests and planned gifts, such as charitable remainder trusts, lead trusts, and beneficiary designations, even more attractive as part of an integrated financial and legacy plan. This extension creates a stable planning environment for major gifts and legacy commitments that support a hospital's mission for years to come.

As with any major tax law change, the practical impact on individual donors and nonprofit organizations will continue to unfold. Experts recommend that donors consult with tax and financial advisors to understand how the new rules affect their personal circumstances and charitable strategies. For the philanthropic community, awareness and proactive planning will be essential in maximizing the law's benefits while navigating any new limitations.

In a period of evolving tax policy, the One Big Beautiful Bill offers both clarity and complexity. For donors to our hospital foundation, it reinforces the importance of thoughtful planned giving, not only as a way to support our shared mission, but as a powerful component of sound financial planning in 2025 and beyond.

To get started, contact your plan administrator and request a direct transfer from your IRA to a qualified nonprofit such as Self Regional Healthcare Foundation. You may give up to the maximum amount permitted by law, which is \$111,000 in 2026.

One added benefit is that this transfer is not counted as taxable income, and you do not need to itemize deductions to take advantage of it.

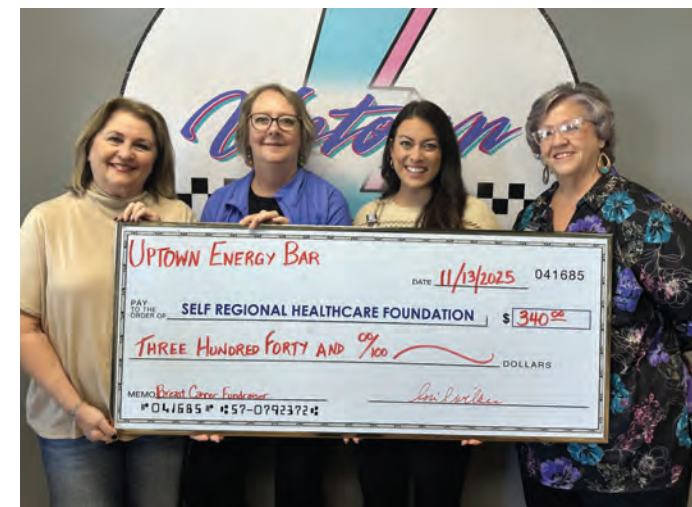

da Vinci Robotic Surgery Technology

Goal: \$2.5 million — Fully Achieved

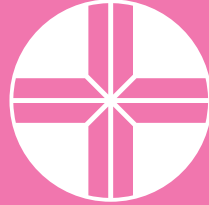

The planned center will bring imaging, diagnostics, clinical services, navigation, and support programs under one roof, providing women with a seamless, compassionate, and highly coordinated experience.

During 2025, project planning and design entered their next stage, with clinical leaders outlining the optimal patient pathways and technology needs. The center will significantly elevate the level of breast health care available in our region and ensure earlier detection, improved outcomes, and expanded access.

Funds raised through the Equation for Progress campaign will make this vision a reality. With your support, we are moving closer to building a place where women can receive comprehensive care in a setting designed specifically for their needs.

3D Mobile Mammography Unit Goal: \$1 million — In Progress

The new 3D mobile mammography vehicle will travel throughout Greenwood County and the surrounding Lakelands region, bringing advanced breast imaging directly to workplaces, churches, schools, and rural communities. This unit will offer the most up-to-date technology available, ensuring clearer images, greater accuracy, and more reliable results.

In 2025, the Foundation continued to secure funds and finalize design considerations for the new vehicle. Once deployed, the mobile unit will dramatically expand screening access for thousands of women each year.

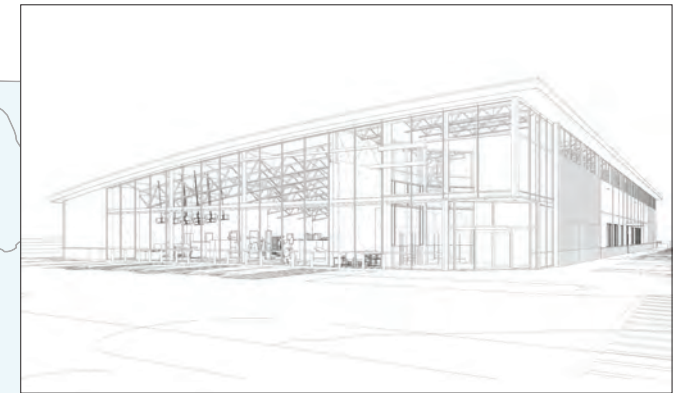
